# **Driving in Severe Spring Weather**

The arrival of spring brings warmer temperatures, but there is always a chance for severe weather like thunderstorms, hail, and tornadoes. It may be difficult to practice, but it's important to have conversations with young drivers to prepare them for unpredictable spring weather.

#### Driving in Thunderstorms

Rain during thunderstorms can make roads slippery and reduce visibility. To see upcoming hazards, drivers should:

- Turn on low-beam headlights.
- Reduce speed and increase distance between vehicles.
- Depending on the severity of the storm and your comfort level, wait until the storm has cleared. Make sure to park away from trees and power lines. If pulling over, turn on your hazard lights to alert other drivers.

#### Driving in Tornadoes and High Winds

- Do not try to outrun a tornado. Tornadoes are unpredictable and can change direction rapidly, making it difficult to outmaneuver them in a vehicle.
- The best course of action is to find a sturdy building to seek shelter.
- If you are unable to make it to a shelter, pull over, duck down below the windows in the vehicle, keep your seat belt fastened, and cover your head with your hands or an object such as a blanket or cushion.
- As an alternative, if you can safely exit your vehicle, take cover in a low lying ditch or ravine and covering your head.
- Stay away from bridges and overpasses.


